	Form A – used if your country is part of the Generalised Scheme of Preferences	Certificate of Origin
	<b>EUR.1</b> – used if your country has signed the preferential trade agreement with the EU	
	<b>Proforma Invoice</b> – used to show importer exact amount to be paid and payment method	Commercial Documents
	<b>Commercial Invoice</b> – used by customs authorities as evidence of export	
	Packing List – used to specify number of goods in in individual packages and gives gross and net weight	
	<b>Phytosanitary Certificate</b> – some natural ingredients for health products require testing before being exported	Administrative
	Health Certificate – suppliers must provide to EU customs authority if exporter country is part of a stricter import condition	and Transport Documents
	<b>Transport Documents</b> – depending on mode of transport, including Bill of Lading, Road Waybill, Rail Waybill, Airway Bill and FIATA Bill of Lading
