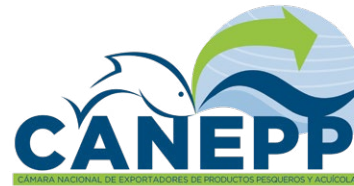

The town of Paredón, Guatemala, used to depend solely on artisanal fishing, until 2008, when BORIV Group created BUBBA and invested in a 13 hectare, semi intensive shrimp farm. In 2019 the company shifted to a hyper-intensive system of production, starting the CSR and ASC certification processes with the aim of growing their international markets for their HOSO and HLSO products (A4, A5).

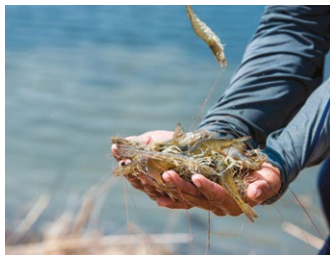

Bajamar Seafood is a Panamanian company with vast experience in the seafood exports market. Last year Bajamar started to sell Jumbo Shrimps vannamei) and Pacific Lobster Tails. They can process 12 ton of fresh fish daily at their facility, and their cold rooms can store 160 tons at 20 C. Their Blast Freezer can reach 30 C and is designed for the IQF process.
